

KINGSTON



VARSITY AND CLUB SPORTS

Teams and individual student athletes represent St. Lawrence College provincially in the Ontario Colleges Athletic Association (OCAA) and nationally in the Canadian Colleges Athletic Association (CCAA). 

COLLABORATIVE DEGREE PROGRAMS WITH LAURENTIAN UNIVERSITY

The Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN) degree programs are offered in our comfortable college environment. Students benefit from small-class sizes, student success resources, and hands-on learning.

BEHAVIOURAL PSYCHOLOGY

SLC's own Honours Bachelor of Behavioural Psychology degree program provides both classroom instruction and more than 1,100 hours of supervised placement in community settings. Offered on the Kingston campus.

ONE-YEAR FOUNDATIONAL PROGRAMS

General Arts & Science certificate streams offer a foundational year for students preparing for the workforce or for future study. Gain important skills and become ready for a full-time diploma program with streams in Applied Arts, Behavioural Psychology, General Studies, Pre-Trades, Social Sciences, and Technology.

Business Fundamentals provide students with a broad and exploratory business education. This program serves as the first year for the business core diploma programs - Business, Accounting, Human Resources, and Marketing - and graduates can choose to pursue one of these diplomas or use their Business Fundamentals certificate as a foundation for other programs of study or their career.

Media Arts Fundamentals is a one-year program that allows students to explore the exciting variety of disciplines and careers in media, design, and the arts.


APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING





Critical care nurses are responsible for the most vulnerable patients, in the most acute care environments. Those working in critical care are expected to monitor, assess and treat critically ill patients and thus must have an in-depth knowledge base and skill level related to the conditions, treatments and environments in which these patients are cared for. Veterinary Assistant *

Students develop surgical support techniques, safe handling skills, perform physical examinations at the local Humane Society, perform dog grooming, and operate the 'Scruffy Dog Salon' on campus. Includes 120-hour field placement. (Code: 0633)



APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS

Apprenticeship is hands-on training for individuals who prefer learning by doing. The training provides access to well-paid jobs that demand a high level of skill, judgement and creativity. Apprenticeships are paid while gaining work experience with wages increasing with their level of skill. Apprenticeship is a proven industrybased learning system that combines job experience with technical training.

Apprenticeship training is recognized as one of the most efficient methods of training and educating skilled trades people. Students who wish to attend these programs must be employed and sponsored by their employer. Each apprenticeship registered in a certified trade must successfully complete training in a College of Applied Arts and Technology or other approved training setting where the theory and practice of the trade is taught. This is in addition to the practical training received on the job.





HOW TO APPLY

Applying is easy!
Find the application at ontariocolleges.ca

Apply to college as soon as the application is available at the beginning of October. You'll be required to submit transcripts and pay an application fee. Applications are considered complete once all application fees and related documents are received. Applications must be received on or before **February 1, 2020** to ensure equal consideration. After this date SLC will not process applications to highly competitive programs unless space is still available. After **February 1, 2020** applications to programs which still have space are considered on a first-come, first-served basis.

HIGHLY COMPETITIVE PROGRAMS

Highly competitive programs are programs for which the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of seats available.

Meeting the minimum admission requirements does not guarantee admission to highly competitive programs and applications may be ranked. Applications are ranked based on grades, including overall and course prerequisite averages. Admission will be offered in order of ranking and some applicants will be placed on a waitlist or denied entrance to the program.
