DOING BUSINESS FOR THE RIGHT REASONS

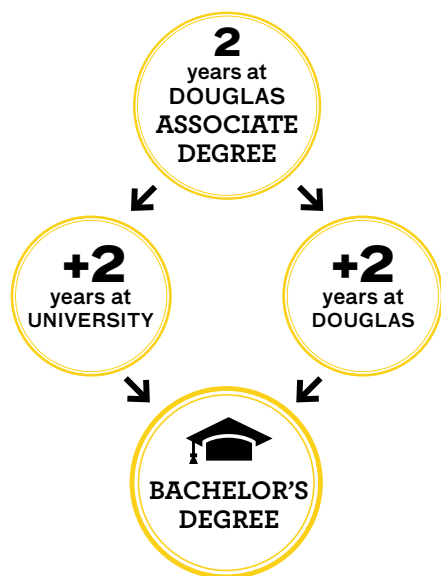

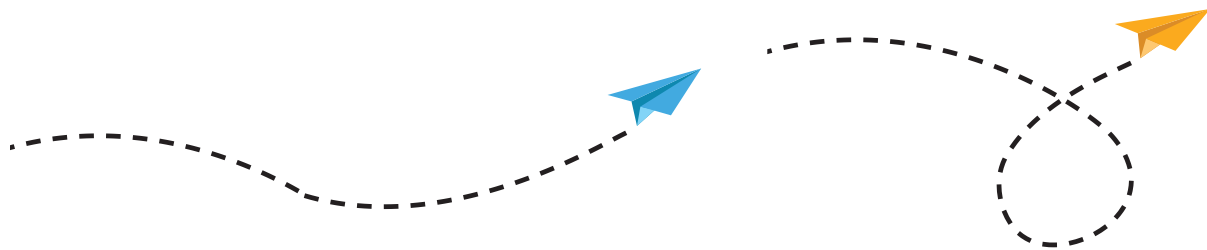

Then, take the credits you've earned and transfer them to a university to finish your degree.

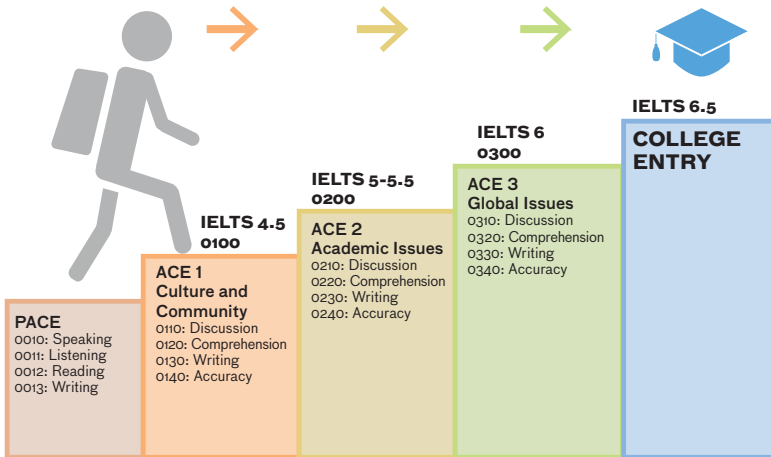

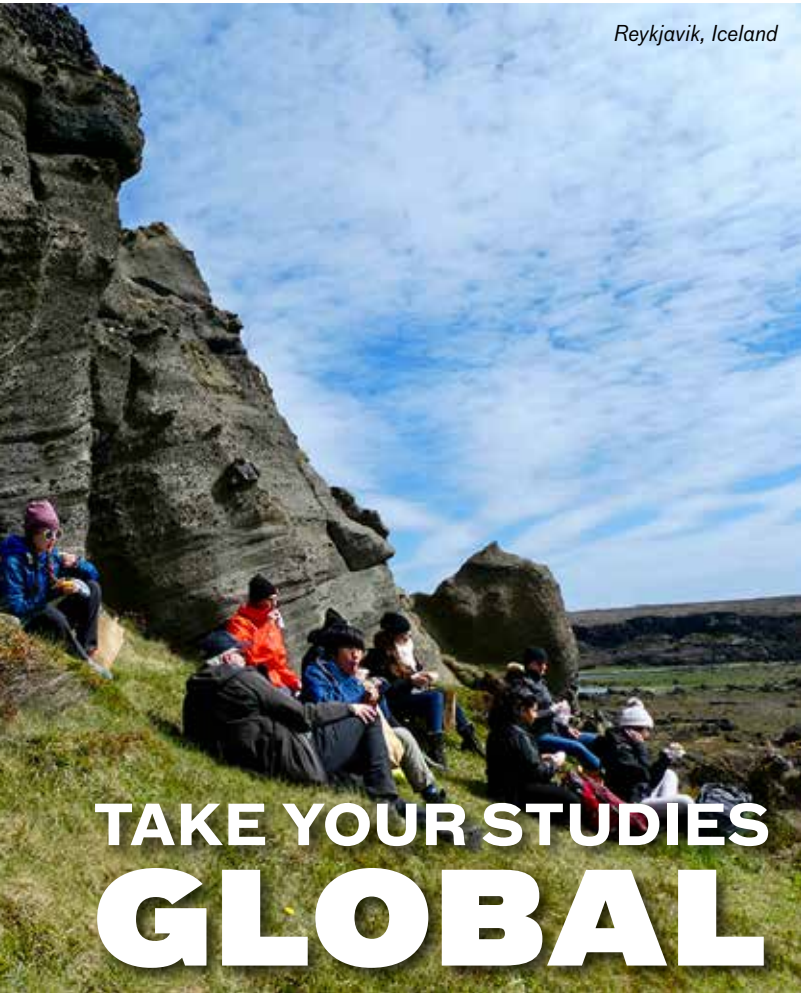

It found me at Florence's Piazza Santo Spirito, the lively square near my apartment where people would dance as music thumped into the night. It found me in the small town of Marciana Marina on the island of Elba, where the streets were lined with bright flowers and each day was a beach day. The Italy field school was my first real travel experience. At times, it was difficult to adjust to the new surroundings and the language barrier, but that's what made the trip so meaningful. I learned so much about myself and, most of all, about how to overcome challenges and stay resilient. The reality of pursuing writing is that I'll have to deal with plenty of rejection. Resilience is a crucial tool for me to hold onto, one that was sharpened by my field school experience.

Degree completion

Take your first two years at Douglas and transfer to the University of Wales, Trinity St. David, to finish a bachelor's degree. You'll experience the rich cultural history of Wales and earn your degree in just one additional year of study. Reduced tuition rates are available for Douglas students.

International co-op

Study at the University of California, Riverside, where you'll earn a Certificate in Hospitality and Tourism Management or a Certificate in Management. Then head to Walt Disney World, in Florida, for six months of paid training, along with online coursework.

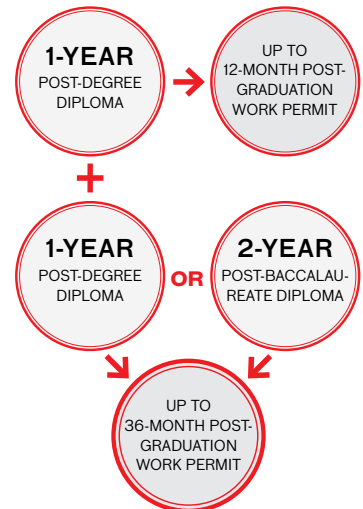

GETTING INTO DOUGLAS

ACADEMIC PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate (diploma, certificate, associate and bachelor's degree) programs:

- High school graduation and minimum 17 years of age by the first day of class; and
- Minimum overall grade average of "C" or equivalent in the final year of high school; and
- Minimum final grade of "C" or equivalent in Grade 11 Mathematics for most programs.

Post-graduate (post-degree and post-baccalaureate) programs:

- Graduation from a recognized degree-granting post-secondary institution with a minimum three-year bachelor's degree; and
- Minimum cumulative grade average of "C" or 60% or equivalent during bachelor's degree program.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

You are required to demonstrate proficiency in the English language prior to admission to Douglas College. You can do so by providing proof of one of the following (other factors may also be considered):

- B.C. high school English 12: minimum grade C (based on course grade and provincial exam).

- Successful completion of four courses at ACE Level 2 and three courses at ACE Level 3 at Douglas College.
