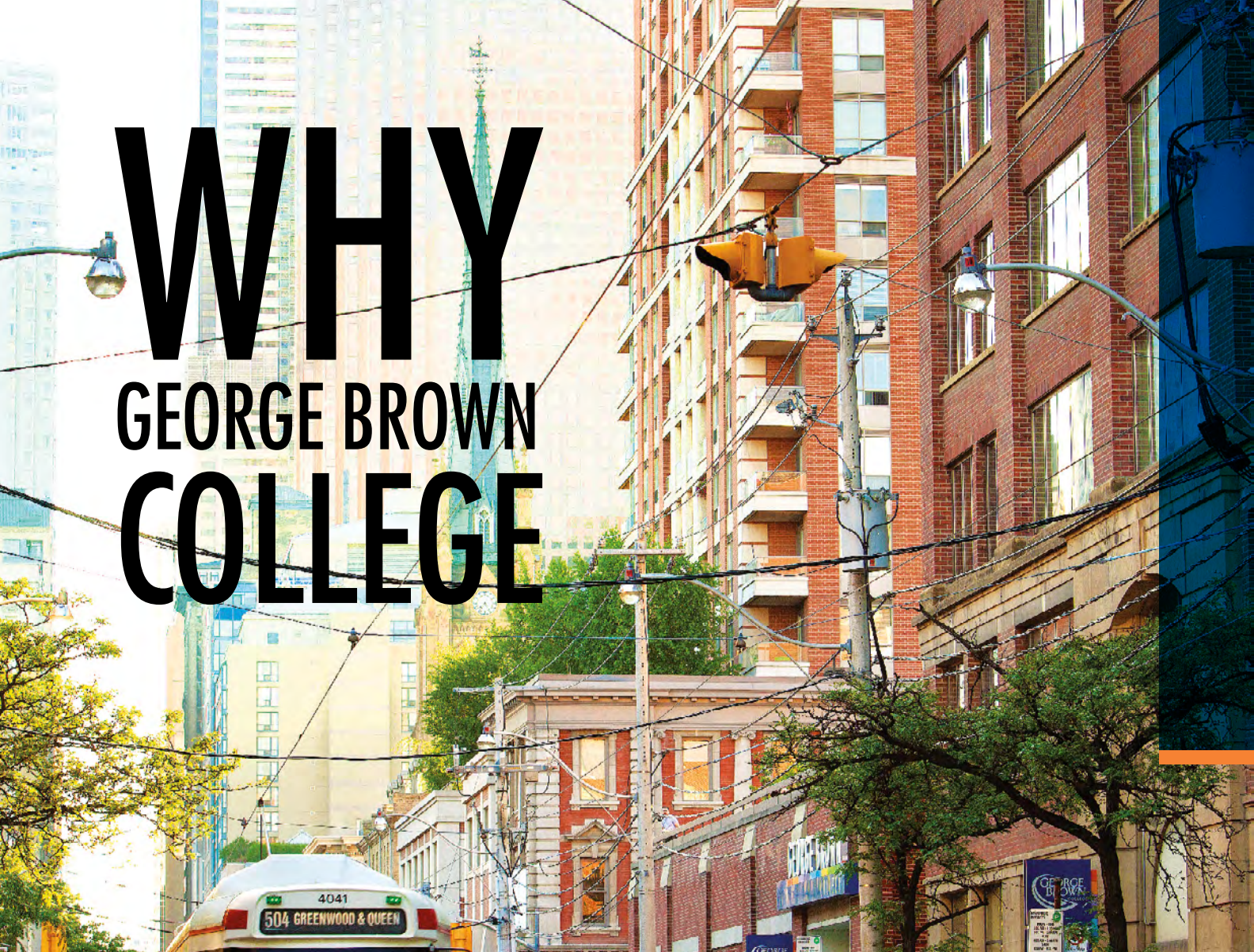

COUNSELLING SERVICES

Being a college student isn't easy! Sometimes you may find yourself feeling stressed or overwhelmed. Talking to a Counsellor can help. Feel free to talk about anything as sessions are completely confidential. Counsellors can help you learn strategies to reduce your stress, connect with resources that will help you cope, and provide a safe space for you to share what's on your mind.

ACCESSIBLE LEARNING SERVICES

If you are a student with a permanent or temporary disability (mental health, medical, learning, physical, or sensory) our team will work with you to create an academic accommodation plan to help you succeed in achieving your goals. If you are a Deaf, deafened, or hard-of-hearing student, we have Consultants fluent in ASL and offer in-class ASL interpretation, computerized note-taking and other accommodations to meet your needs.



PEER CONNECT

Sometimes you just want to connect with another student who understands the demands you're facing. Our trained peer coaches can share resources and guide you in developing strategies for your academic success and well-being at college. Activities and regular 20-minute workshops are available to help you study well, work well, and live well.



CAREER SERVICES

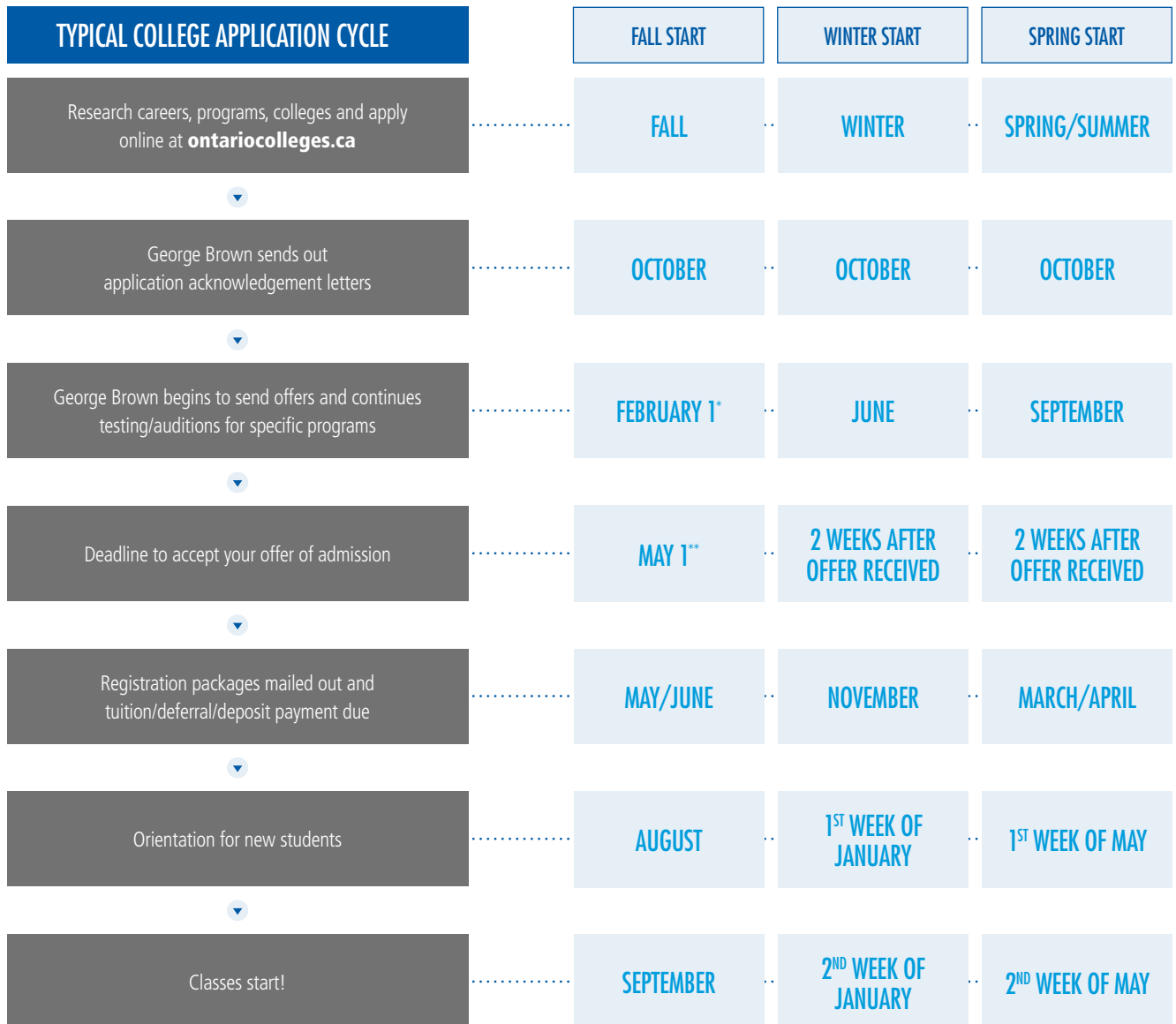


HOW TO APPLY FOR COLLEGE

- ③ If you're currently in high school, log in to your account to verify that your school grades are correct. If you're not in high school, you can request your transcripts as part of your application OR contact your school to request an official transcript be mailed to ontariocolleges.ca (include your application number).

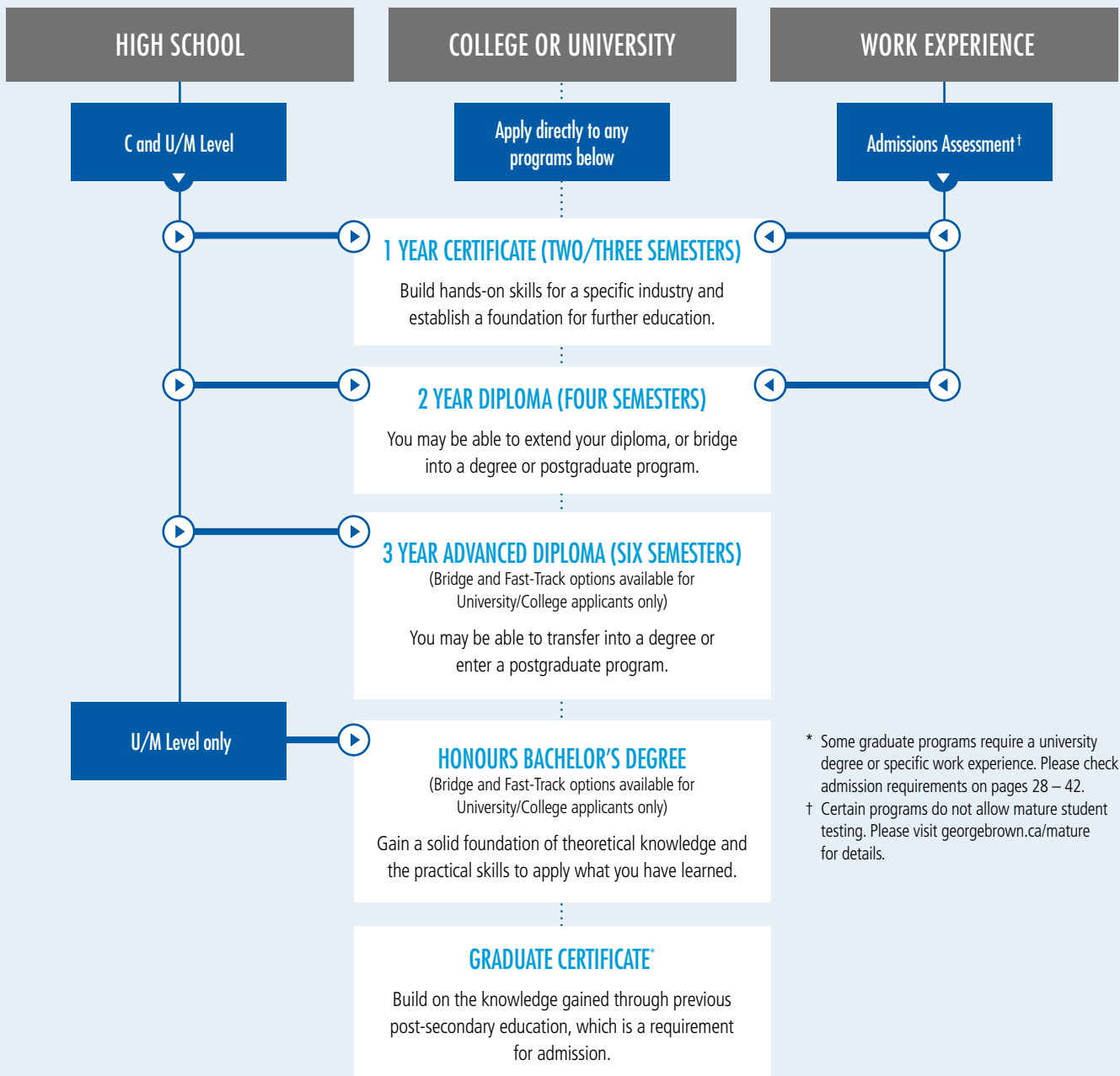

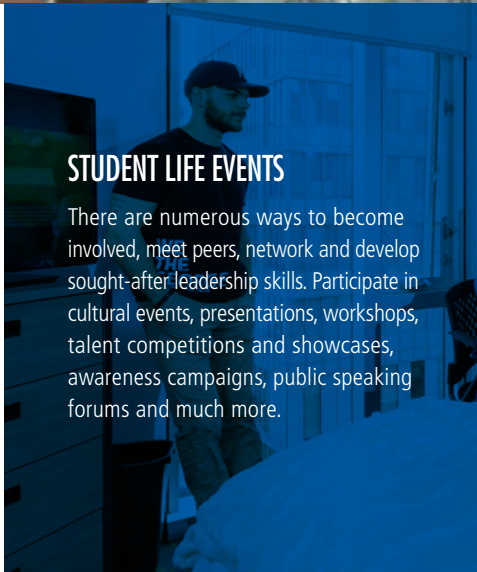

DEGREES WITH DIRECTION

Our career-focused bachelor's degrees mean you'll graduate with the academic credentials as well as the people and technical skills employers are looking for. You'll benefit from smaller class sizes, professors with years of professional experience and field education opportunities that will allow you to learn while networking with potential employers.

Bachelor of Science (Nursing) S118

Offered in collaboration with Centennial College and Ryerson University, this degree meets the entry-to-practice requirements adopted by the College of Nurses of Ontario. Graduates earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Ryerson.

Honours Bachelor of Behaviour Analysis S302

This four-year degree takes an in-depth look at Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) – a field of study that uses a systematic and analytical approach to modify behaviour in a desirable way. Fast-track stream now available for students with previous post-secondary education. See S303 for details.

Honours Bachelor of Commerce (Culinary Management) H315

Our commitment to industry leadership has led to the launch of the first four-year Culinary Management bachelor's degree in Canada. Through a blend of theoretical and real-world education, you will gain the skills and knowledge to achieve a successful career in today's culinary and food industry.

Honours Bachelor of Commerce (Financial Services) B302

Combine the benefits of an applied, practical education with the theory of a degree. You'll gain the knowledge, skills and real-world experience for a career as an accountant or financial planner.

Honours Bachelor of Digital Experience Design G301

This four-year degree produces designers who can solve problems using human-centered, socially conscious and economically viable digital solutions. Curriculum focuses on three learning areas of the digital experience design process: Think, Make and Ship.

Honours Bachelor of Early Childhood Leadership C300

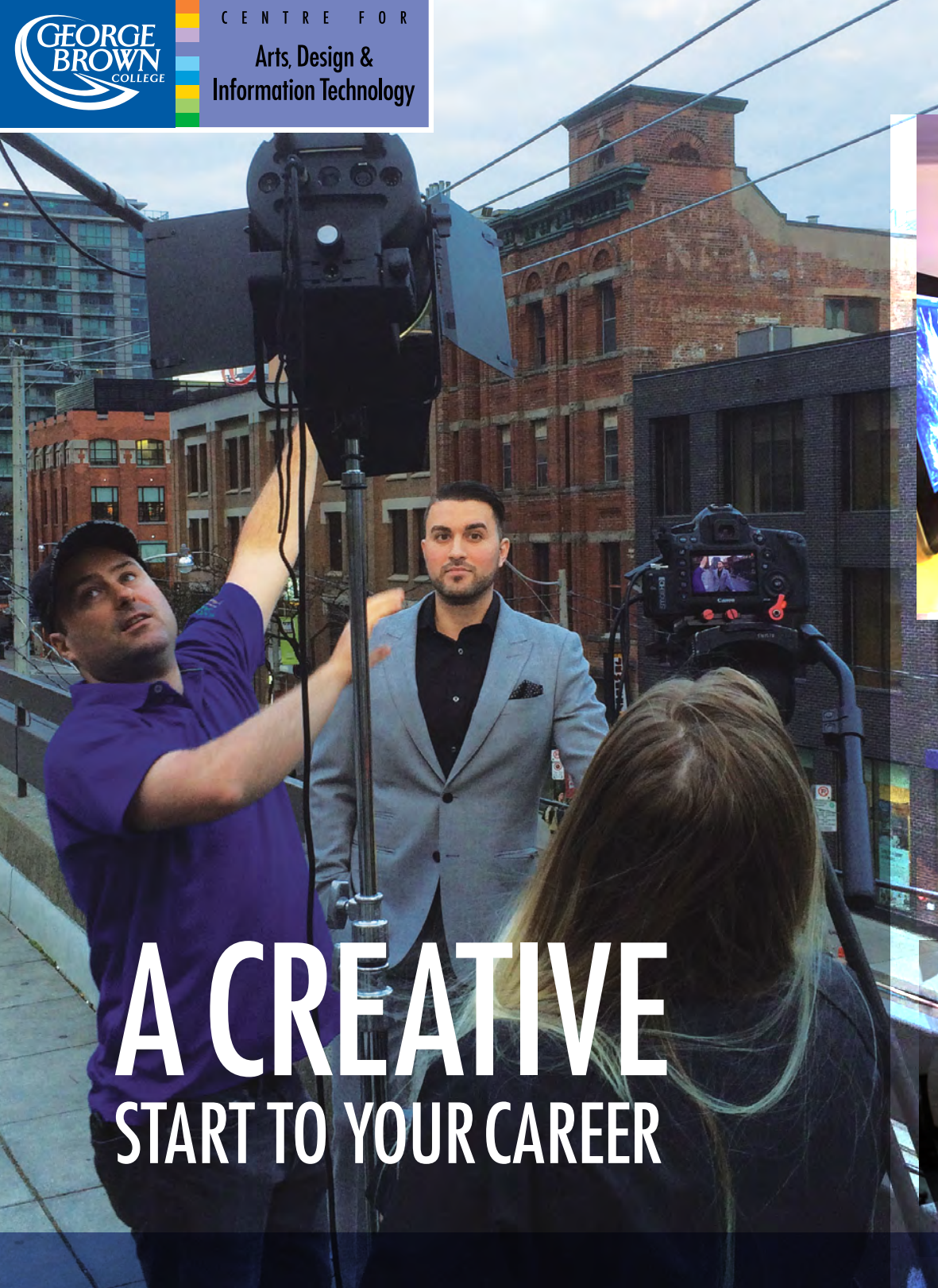

Our programs combine classroom theory with hands-on experience to help prepare you to work with and for local communities. Whether you want to engage with children, marginalized youth or adults, or members of the Deaf community, we can help prepare you for a rewarding career that involves doing important work.

CHECK IT OUT

Every program in the School of Social and Community Services offers a field education opportunity. These experiences are key to your overall learning as you will learn how to apply classroom theory to a real-world environment. They also give you the chance to start developing a professional network outside of the classroom.

LEARN BY DOING

Imagine going to school and actually practicing the job you will be doing after graduation. As a student in the School of Early Childhood, you will put your skills to work by gaining valuable hands-on experience at a field education – either with a placement partner or at one of our 12 George Brown-managed child care “lab schools.” Run by trained professionals and relied upon by hundreds of families, these lab schools are all about learning-by-doing.

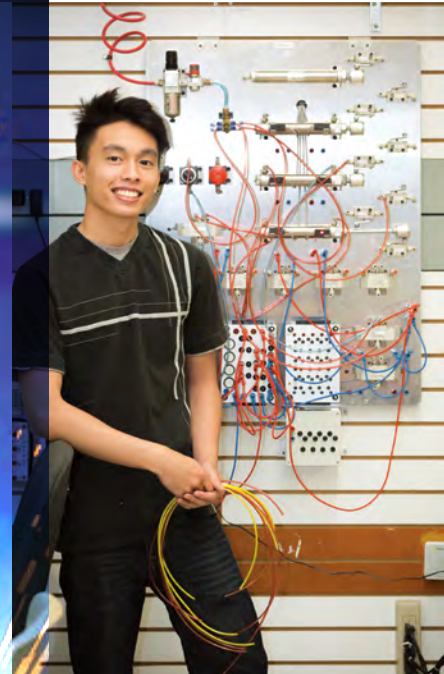

We provide innovative educational opportunities for a variety of student groups, including many whose needs are not met by conventional academic programs. Our offerings include programs that build essential language or academic skills (such as English as a Second Language, Occupation-Specific Language Training and Academic Upgrading), programs that can lead to employment or further post-secondary education, programs for students with a history of mental health issues and/or addiction challenges, programs for immigrants as well as Indigenous Education & Services.

CHECK IT OUT

The Community Partnerships Office (CPO) has programs that contribute to the social and economic fabric of our City. These programs aim to increase access to post-secondary education, build a skilled and knowledgeable workforce, and respond to the diverse needs of employers. The CPO has a diverse range of partners from school boards to corporate employers, and serves a range of individuals including high school students, individuals who are first in the family to go to college, those returning to post-secondary for a second time, and those looking to participate in skilled employment programs.

PATHWAYS TO FURTHER EDUCATION

George Brown has agreements with several universities, allowing eligible graduates of the General Arts & Science (GAS) diploma admission to Liberal Arts and Humanities degree programs, usually with transfer credits. Students who complete the GAS diploma with a minimum average of 75%, may be eligible for admission into an Honours Bachelor of Arts at the University of Waterloo with as many as 9.5 transfer credits, equaling up to two years of advanced standing towards a four year degree! We also have agreements with other universities including U of T, Royal Roads, Athabasca, the University of Sussex, as well as others.

- The facility and the programming offered are designed to meet workforce demand by providing specialized, industry-identified skills training.

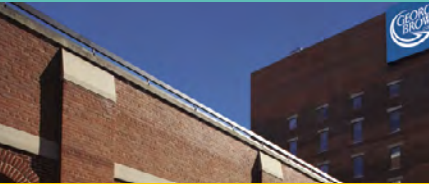
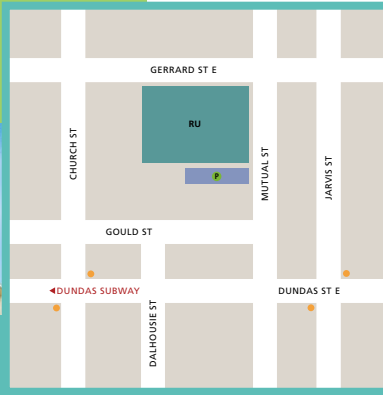

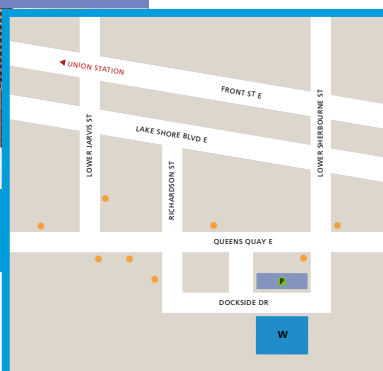
